Guidelines for organizers of academic events in philosophy of physics

In order to promote inclusion in academic events and facilitate the participation of scholars with different nationalities and living in different countries, we encourage conference/workshop organizers to take the following recommendations into account:

- **Visa processing times:** The estimated wait time to receive a nonimmigrant visa can vary substantially depending on the country of citizenship. In some cases, it can take several months. We therefore recommend to inform scholars about the acceptance of their contribution at least 5 months before the start date of the event, if it is feasible.
- Organization of conferences in welcoming countries: We encourage the organization of events in countries with minimal visa requirements, so that they can be attended by those whose passports score lower on the passport index https://www.passportindex.org. Here is the list of countries ranked by how many passports they accept visa-free: https://www.passportindex.org/byIndividualRank.php
- Organization of conferences outside typical locations: In order to increase the participation of scholars living in different parts of the world, we recommend organizing events in geographically diverse areas, including countries other than the typical conference locations.
- Reimbursement for visa costs: In some cases, the costs of a visa
 application can be very high. In some cases, the costs of a visa application
 can be very high, including hidden costs of biometric appointments, travel
 costs to in-person visa appointments, canceled flights following delayed or
 refused applications, and required third-party service fees. We therefore
 encourage organizers, if there is funding available, to cover visa expenses in
 addition to travel and accommodation costs.
- **Hybrid events**: If feasible, organizers should consider hybrid options to promote inclusion in academic events and facilitate the attendance of scholars who, for different reasons, may not be able to participate in person.
- Support for parents: We recommend that conferences/workshops facilitate
 the participation of parents, who may want to attend the event. This implies
 providing support for child care, either at the conference facility or at the
 parent's home; providing a lactation room equipped to accommodate the
 needs of nursing mothers; and, especially in cases of breastfeeding babies or
 special needs, considering the additional costs associated with a child
 caregiver.
